Admin Report - October 7, 2024

• Student population for the September 2024 count is as follows:

Grade 7 – 78; Grade 8 – 61; Grade 9 – 64. TOTAL = 203

We continue to see families arriving to our school through One World ... One Centre. Many of our new families to St. Mark are new to Canada with limited English language. This has increased our need for further diverse programing, targeted language support as well as some inclusive support. At the end of September, we successful acquisitioned contingency funding with the division to separate our Grade 7 class into three classes for part of the school day (ELA, Social, Math, Science, Health). This means that we are currently in rebuild of our timetable along with some other trickle-down impacts.

We also welcome back J. Isaac to St. Mark in her new role as Braided Journeys Coach. Ms. Isaac was a TABT with us last year.

With enrolment increase, we are also expecting some monies to be directed to schools through the one-time provincial government's injection of funds to school divisions who have had dramatic population increased. In combination with the funds received through contingency, we will present our 2024-2025 operational budget at next month's meeting.

- September was a month to get to know students as well as division baseline assessments. The reading screeners were once again completed along with a new assessment in writing (social and English combined piece). Math screeners will be coming shortly.
- Our Grade 7s enjoyed a day of retreat at the end of September. The format has changed this year and was a great bonding experience for the students and their homeroom teachers. Students spent some reflection time at Coronation Park, followed by games and lunch at the school. Students then went to the Valley Zoo for the afternoon.
- October saw our Terry Fox Run. Donations can be made until Tuesday, October 15.
- Students will be enjoying our traditional start-up activities and celebrations: the Thanksgiving celebration as well as our Leadership Team hosting the welcome back activities.
- Sports has begun in ECSD. Mr. Alvarez and Mr. de Brito coached our St. Mark's boys' soccer team and made it all the way to the championship. Unfortunately, our Lion's lost out 2-1 in the final match.

Our volleyball season is under way. Mr. Ferzli will be coaching a boys' team and we have our volunteer coach, S. Greenways coaching the girls.
